Town of Jewett Ambulance Policy  
July 23, 2008

1. The Town of Jewett shall provide general ambulance service within the boundaries of the Town, twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven days a week. The service shall include providing pre-hospital emergency medical treatment and transportation to a hospital for residents of the Town suffering from an illness or injury.
2. Definitions:
  - A. "Resident" of the Town is:
    - I. An individual who is a resident and pays real property tax to the Town: or
    - II. A member of the immediate family of a resident defined above and below:
      - a. Son or daughter; or
      - b. Mother or father
  - B. "Illness" or "Injury" is:
    - I. A medical condition necessitating the immediate treatment and transportation of the afflicted person in accordance with accepted standards of pre-hospital emergency care to the nearest appropriate facility.
3. It is understood that the emergency services furnished by the Town shall include only emergency transportation of patients to Columbia Memorial Hospital, Hudson; Albany Medical Center, Albany; Kingston Hospital, Kingston; or Benedictine, Kingston.

4. It is understood by any patient that requires or desires to be transported to a destination other than one of these enumerated above, that any additional cost of transportation to a non-enumerated facility shall be borne by the patient.
5. The Town of Jewett retains the right to file claims for reimbursement with the insurance carriers of those using the Town's ambulance service. The monies collected from said insurance carriers shall be allocated to offset the cost of the Town of Jewett in providing said ambulance services.
